

Range Safety Rules: A few quick notes:

This will be a FUN event. We will even have electronic moving targets to shoot at this time. But, as always, Safety comes first! Please read the below.

EYE AND EAR PROTECTION is **absolutely mandatory** for participant's, spectators and range personnel while on or near the stages of fire. (prescription glasses qualify as safe eyewear.)

FIREARMS should be unloaded and cased or remain in the participant's holster with the magazine removed. All firearms used by participants shall be serviceable and safe.

SAFETY BRIEFING: A mandatory meeting will be held prior to the start of the event to ensure that all participants are familiar with the rules.

Event will be run on a **COLD RANGE:** Definition: Participants' firearms will remain **unloaded** at the event site except under the direction and supervision of an Event Official and/or Range Officer.

MUZZLE SAFETY: 180-degree plane is an imaginary infinite vertical plane drawn through the centerline of the participant's body.

GENERAL SAFETY AND COMPETITION GUIDELINES

- All participants are liable and responsible for the care and handling of their own firearms in a safe and secure manner.
- No food or drinks will be allowed on the firing line.
- Pay strict attention to the Range Officers while on the firing line.

All firearms will remain in holsters or carrying cases until the shooters are on the firing line and ready to fire. Firearms will be pointed down-range at all times when not in a holster or carrying case.

Ammunition: We respectfully ask that you NOT bring Magnum, +P, or +P+ ammunition.

NOTE:

- This event is HANDGUN only.
- If you do not have a handgun there will be several of us who will have loaners.
 - o Ammunition is somewhat expensive, even if you don't have a gun, you might buy some ammo to bring and shoot. (Modern Arms, Target Masters, even Wal-Mart)
 - o If you want to shoot a semi-automatic buy yourself a box of:
 - "9 millimeter" or
 - "22 caliber" or
 - "45 caliber"
 - o If you want to shoot a *revolver*, buy a box of "38 caliber"
- **But note:** do NOT buy STEEL case ammo! Brass or even aluminum are ok.
- The clerk should know what you need.
